FAQ's

Who is this site for?

This site is designed for anyone who would like to find out what benefits and programs they might qualify for in the state of Washington. The online application is for residents of Washington State to apply for Federal, State, or local benefits.

What qualifies me as a Washington resident?

A resident under **Basic Food Eligibility** is someone who is living in Washington; and is not receiving assistance from another state or tribe.

A resident under **Cash Eligibility** is someone who is living in Washington; and is not receiving comparable assistance from another state or tribe; Intends to remain in the state permanently or indefinitely; or entered the state looking for a job or a job commitment.

A resident under special circumstances for **nursing facilities** is someone who enters Washington solely for medical care in a nursing facility. A person placed in a nursing facility by another state, is considered a resident of the state that placed them.

Residency requirements for Temporary Visa Holders must first meet citizenship and alien status requirements as they are stated in <http://app.leg.wa.gov/wac/default.aspx?cite=388-424>**How long will it take me to check eligibility and apply?**

The **See If I Qualify** screening may take as little as 15 minutes. The online application, **Apply Now** can take about an hour to complete.

How much will it cost to check eligibility and apply?

There is no cost to you for completing the **See If I Qualify** screening or submitting an application.

Why would I use this site?

There are many reasons to use this site. First, this site offers you the ability to check for various services and programs that may be available to you. Secondly, it provides a vast array of information on resources available in the community. And, finally you can apply for some programs directly on this site.

I don't see the benefit program I need, where would I look?

The **Find Services** page explains how to use the **See If I Qualify** feature as well as a list of other community resource links.

What questions do I need to answer?

The **See If I Qualify** screening asks basic questions about your household members and their income, resources and expenses to see what benefits you may qualify for. The online application, **Apply Now** goes into more detail if you choose to apply for some programs.

When will I know which programs I may be eligible for?

When you have entered all your information for the **See If I Qualify** screening, a results page displays showing benefits and programs you may qualify for.

What do I do if I get an error on a page?

If there is an error on the page, it appears in red letters by the field that has an error. Correct the information in the field with the error. If you still run into issues, select the **Contact Us** link at the bottom of the page. Make sure to include the error message you received and what page you were on when you received the error message. Please note that copy and paste functions do not work in the **Contact Us comment** section.

Will the online application save my information if my computer browser times out?

The online application automatically saves each time you navigate to a new page. However, if you have not created a SecureAccess Washington (SAW) account, you may not be able to access your application information again.

Now that my application has been submitted, what do I need to do next?

If you are submitting an application on-line during regular business hours, it is available for processing within just a few minutes. If you are submitting an application on-line after normal working hours (after 5pm, on a weekend or holiday) it will be dated as received on the next regular business day. Some programs require an interview; others don't. You will receive a letter in the mail notifying you of next steps.

You may be contacted to provide additional information or proof of your circumstances such as:

- Social Security Numbers if not already provided.
- Proof of income, such as: copies of checks, check stubs, letters or statements from anyone who gave your household money.
- Proof of resources you may have, such as: vehicle registration, bank statements, stocks, bonds, life insurance policies.
- Proof of costs for child care or dependent adult care such as: a receipt from your provider.
- Proof of housing costs such as: mortgage payments, property tax payments, homeowner's insurance, rent receipts, copy of your lease, utility bills, letter from your landlord.
- Other proof such as: unpaid medical bills, health insurance premiums, pregnancy with due date, changes to your immigration or citizenship status, adoption support or foster care payments.

IF YOU APPLIED FOR CASH, MEDICAL, FOOD ASSISTANCE, OR CHILDCARE SUBSIDY PROGRAMS:

Your application will be sent to DSHS for processing; except, if you're applying for the Child Care Subsidy Programs your information will be sent to the Department of Children, Youth, and Families for processing.

To process your application for cash and food assistance faster:

Call us between 8AM and 3PM, Monday through Friday, at 1-877-501-2233; or

Visit us in person from 8AM-3PM, Monday through Friday at any local office. You can use the office locator to find your local DSHS Community Services Office.

You may not need an interview if everyone in your household is age 60 or over and you have no earned income.

To process your application for childcare, you can wait until you receive a letter to advise you of the status, or you can call the Department of Children, Youth, and Families between 8:00 AM and 4:30 PM, Monday through Friday, at 1-844-626-8687.

Medicare

Who is eligible for Medicare?

Generally, Medicare is available for people age 65 or older, younger people with disabilities and people with End Stage Renal Disease (permanent kidney failure requiring dialysis or transplant). Medicare has two parts, Part A (Hospital Insurance) and Part B (Medicare Insurance). You are eligible for premium-free Part A if you are age 65 or older and you or your spouse worked and paid Medicare taxes for at least 10 years. You can get Part A at age 65 without having to pay premiums if:

- You are receiving retirement benefits from Social Security or the Railroad Retirement Board.
- You are eligible to receive Social Security or Railroad benefits, but you have not yet filed for them.
- You or your spouse had Medicare-covered government employment.

DISPATCH ASSISTANT – COLVILLE, WA

Answers the telephone, responds to inquiries, screen customers for eligibility, provides clerical support for transportation. Reviews eligibility applications and assists with monitoring and tracking of client data. Provides training, supervision, and oversight to seven to ten drivers with regard to operational standards and safe practices. Maintenance Coordinator-Oversees the operational readiness of vehicle and assigns vehicle to outlying areas. Maintains the database of all maintenance service, VCR, and repair records. Archives documents and maintains up to date file log and coordinates repair work, tires, heating, air conditioning, vehicle washing and body work. Requisitions all A/P and P/O's as needed. Case Managers are responsible for the development, implementation, and monitoring of Long-Term Care Services to Medicaid recipients, 18 and older. Services are responsive to the needs of the client that enable them to reside in their home setting of choice, while meeting quality assurance measures in accordance to Medicaid and Health Care Authority regulations and policies. Case Managers provide client-centered approaches to support the client's independence and administer the department's Comprehensive Assessment, Reporting & Evaluation (CARE) assessment that determines functional eligibility. 32-40 hours per week, \$17.48 to \$18.91 per hour, DOE

HEAD START CLASSROOM AIDE (TEMPORARY/INTERMITTENT) – COLVILLE, WA

Anticipated duration: August 25, 2021 – June 13, 2022, Works under close supervision of teaching staff to assist in conducting the activities of a Head Start preschool program. This includes providing a safe and healthy classroom environment providing a quality social and academic experience for children. Sets up the classroom meals. May also be required to fulfill role of Bus Monitor which includes additional duties. Assists the bus driver in providing safe and punctual transportation for children to and from the centers to promote the well-being of all children. Monitors the safety of the children on the bus. Ensures that children are transported in a healthy and educational environment and facilitate communication with staff and parents regarding the children's needs and center activities. 36-40 hours per week, 13.69 per hour

CARE COORDINATOR/CASE MANAGER (HYBRID WORK ENVIRONMENT BETWEEN OFFICE AND WORK FROM HOME) – COLVILLE, WA

Provides care coordination services to eligible individuals and their families. Assesses needs, develops and monitors implementation of service plans, makes appropriate referrals and serves as a client advocate with other service providers. Responsible for follow up with clients regardless of setting to coordinate care and follow up services as needed. Works with individuals and their families to assist them to identify and access supports. Uses health education and motivational interviewing techniques to build engagement in goals, increase resiliency and build a pathway for continued health improvement and a healthy lifestyle.

Utilizes health promotion, wellness coaching and awareness of chronic health condition to support client's continued health and improvement. Works to facilitate a reduction in utilization of emergency services and decrease recurrence of hospitalizations. ***Hybrid work environment between office and home*** 36-40 hours per week, \$17.48- \$18.91 per hour, DOE

HEAD START ASSISTANT TEACHER – NEWPORT, WA

Full Time position, 40 hours per week, salaried non-exempt position with paid leave for Winter, Spring and Summer Breaks. Salary is \$2094-\$2157 per month, which associates to \$15.32-\$15.78 per hour, D.O.E. Position is open until filled.

Assists Lead Teacher in planning, organizing and conducting activities in a Head Start classroom to provide a quality preschool experience for children.

The Assistant Teacher works under supervision of the Lead Teacher but is able to perform most tasks independently. The Assistant Teacher is involved in training which would provide them with a solid background of knowledge in early childhood education and adult learning.
